PRESIDING JUDGE ORDER NO. 21DR00000
ORDER RE: FAMILY & PROBATE PROCEEDINGS

On March 27, 2021, Oregon Supreme Court Justice Martha Walters issued Chief Justice Order (CJO) 21-009 imposing updated restrictions on court operations during the COVID-19 pandemic.


Consistent with that CJO, I hereby ORDER as follows:

All Family Law and Probate proceedings shall be held remotely, unless in-person appearance is approved in accordance with this Order, below.

Any participant who wishes to appear in-person shall file a motion requesting in person appearance and shall state a reason why an exception should be made to the requirement of remote appearance. The Chief Family Law Judge will determine whether personal appearance will be allowed, unless the case is retained by another judge. Requests for personal appearance in retained cases will be decided by the judge retaining the case.

This Order takes effect May 24, 2021 and supersedes the Presiding Judge Orders (PJO) 20DR00000 dated December 17, 2020, and PJO 21DR00000 January 20, 2021. This Order shall remain in effect until amended or terminated by further order of this court.
